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Faith-Based Tourism: Scholars and Stakeholders Meet in Malta to Discuss a 'New' Niche Market

Over the next two days, an international conference will be held in Qawra, co-convened by the Malta Tourism Authority (MTA), the University of Malta, the Dublin Institute of Technology (Ireland) and the Leeds Beckett University (United Kingdom). This conference is of national importance and will provide a platform for the creation of a niche market of Faith-Based Tourism. The latter is an umbrella term for, among others, religious tourism, pilgrimage, secular pilgrimage and cultural tourism with interest in religion and dark tourism.

The initiative for the conference comes from Dr Dane Munro, who has been researching and studying faith-based tourism at the Institute for Tourism, Travel and Culture (ITTC), within the University of Malta. This coincided with a renewed effort by MTA, spearheaded by its Deputy CEO, Mr Leslie Vella, to develop this niche market and bring it to a more prominent position in the Maltese tourism product.

Worldwide, the faith-based tourism market is experiencing substantial growth and pilgrimage centres of different religions have been reporting increasing interest. In the last decade or so, visitor numbers connected to faith-based tourism have increased rapidly, contributing to a growing economic sector.

While tourism is a vital pillar of the Maltese economy, with a well-developed infrastructure, work is still going on in order to foster faith-based tourism by enhancing related products and services so that the islands can start to attract their fair share of pilgrimage tourists. Maltese religious, cultural and tourism authorities are collaborating in order to embark on a common campaign. This week's conference will provide a great opportunity for all stakeholders to discover the opportunities that exist in this niche market.

Malta already welcomes a number of pilgrims and religious tourists, but this is mainly done through an uncoordinated effort, and Malta's assets can certainly be utilised further. There are

more than 590 places of worship in Malta, but very few are open all day for visitors in a structured way. All this wealth, access and progress can entice more interest for faith-based tourism or pilgrimages beyond the Maltese archipelago. Faith-based tourism is quite resistant to financial and economic turbulence and in the present, volatile world, a new and stable branch of tourism is more than welcome.

This week's conference has two main objectives. On the first day there will be a presentation of position papers aimed at the stakeholders of the Maltese tourism sector, such as hotel and restaurant entrepreneurs, service providers, site owners or managers, the Church, event organisers and heritage managers.

The following two days are meant for academia to bring cutting edge research in faith-based tourism into a wider global perspective and at the same time focus on the small island reality of Malta.

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It-Turiżmu u l-Fidi: Studjuži u Stakeholders Jiltaqgħu Hawn Malta Biex Jiddiskutu Suq Turistiku ‘Gdid’

Bejn nhar il-Hamis u nhar is-Sibt li ġej, konferenza internazzjonal se ssir il-Qawra, organizzata mill-Awtorità Maltija għat-Turiżmu (MTA), l-Università ta' Malta, l-Istitut ta' Dublin għat-Teknoloġija u Leeds Beckett University, mir-Renju Unit.

Se tkun konferenza ta' importanza internazzjonal u se tipprovdi pjattaforma għall-ħolqien ta' suq speċjalizzat, li jgħaqqa it-turiżmu mal-fidi. Din l-għaqda tħinkludi, fost oħrajn, turiżmu reliġjuż, pellegrinaġġi (inklu dawk sekulari), turiżmu kulturali b'interess fir-reliġjon, u turiżmu oskur.

L-inizjattiva għall-konferenza nibtet minn Dr Dane Munro, li jirriċerka u jistudja t-turiżmu relatati mal-fidi fl-Istitut għat-Turiżmu, Vjaġġar u Kultura (ITTC) fi ħdan l-Università ta' Malta. Dan fl-istess waqt li l-MTA, permezz tal-isforzi tad-deputat CEO, is-sur Leslie Vella, tinsab impenjata tiżviluppa suq speċjalizzat li għandu pozizzjoni aktar prominenti fil-prodott turistiku Malti.

Madwar id-dinja, turiżmu abbażi ta' fidi misttendi jikber sostanzjalment u ċentri ta' pellegrinaġġ minn reliġjonijiet differenti qed jirrapportaw żidiet fin-numru ta' pellegrini. Tul l-aħħar għaxar snin, l-ammont ta' viżitaturi relatati ma' fidi abbażi ta' turiżmu żdiedu b'mod mgħażżeġ, u kkontribwixx lejn tkabbir f'setturi ekonomiċi.

Hawn Malta, filwaqt li t-turiżmu huwa parti importanti mill-ekonomija, għad fadal xi jsir biex it-turiżmu relatax mal-fidi jħalli impatt sinnifikati u biex jingiebu lejn Malta aktar pellegrini. L-MTA qed tieħu l-inizjattiva u theggex il-kollaborazzjoni bejn l-awtoritajiet reliġjuži, kulturali u partijiet interessati fis-settur turistiku, sabiex tinħoloq kampanja komuni. Il-konferenza li se tibda nhar il-Hamis se tipprovdi opportunità tajba għall-istakeholders kollha, sabiex jiskopru l-opportunitajiet f'dan is-suq speċjalizzat. Malta diġa' tilqa' numru ta' pellegrini u turisti għal skop ta' reliġjon, imma dan isir permezz ta' sforz li jista' jkun ikkordinat ħafna aħjar.

Hawn aktar minn 590 post ta' qima hawn Malta, imma ftit jifθu l-bibien tagħhom jum šiħ għall-viżitatuti b'mod strutturat. Dan il-ġid kollu flimkien ma' aktar aċċess u progress jistgħu jwasslu għal turiżmu bbażat fuq il-fidi, li huwa reżistenti għall-kriżiżjet ekonomiċi u finanzjari li jolqtu x-xena internazzjonali u joffri settur pjuttost stabbli fil-qasam turistiku.

Il-konferenza għandha żewġ għanijiet. Fl-ewwel jum issir prezantazzjoni ta' ‘position papers’ immirati lejn stakeholders fis-settur turistiku, il-Knisja, u dawk li għandhom x’jaqsmu ma’ siti turistici. Il-jumejn ta’ wara huma intenzjonati biex persuni akkademiċi jiddikustu mezzi kif irriċerka tagħhom dwar it-turiżmu u l-fidi tista’ tieħu perspettiva globali u fl-istess waqt issir referenza speċifika għar-realta’ ta’ Malta.
